The city has been having continuous problems with grease buildup in the sanitary line that runs in the alley behind city hall.

Loren and Dave spoke about having the local restaurants and bars in town install grease traps to prevent blockages from happening.

Dave doesn't believe there is a current local ordinance, plumbing code, or a MN Statute that would allow the city to retroactively require established restaurants in town to install grease traps. In new facilities the city can require it, but making a business install one after the fact doesn't appear to be a rule anywhere.

Dave spoke to some of his coworkers and they have seen cities offer to pay a portion of the installation of a trap, but that percentage varied from city to city. Dave said on average it looked like cities chipped in about half of the cost of the grease trap.

A grease trap for Charlies, for example, will cost about \$1500, but could be a couple hundred less depending on the size of the triple compartment sink.

I'm not expecting the council to make a decision on anything at the moment. I'm just sharing this information to make everyone aware of the problem and to start thinking about solutions so we can try to prevent backups in the future.
