- 2. We have two applicants for the snow removal position.
- 3. It's time to discuss replacing the public works van.
- 4. Reminder to Council to complete the LMC elected officials training.
- 5. The following addendum is asking for us to sign a petition that would strengthen the trail system that connects to our community. Consider voting in favor of the proposed trail system.

Dear Members of the Stearns County Parks, Trails, and Recreation Master Plan committee:

We, the cities on the existing and proposed Bike and Walking trails in Stearns County, are hereby petitioning for the creation of a 24+/- mile trail in the MN state Highway 4 right-of-way to be part of the Stearns County Parks and Trails 10-20 year Master Plan. Beginning at the junction of MN-4 and I-94 traveling south, crossing MN-55, and continuing along Kandiyohi CR6 for 1-1/2 miles where it intersects the Glacial Lakes Trail.

From the Rails to Trails website, <a href="https://www.railstotrails.org/experience-trails/benefits-of-trails/">https://www.railstotrails.org/experience-trails/benefits-of-trails/</a> the following are benefits that our county citizens, cities and business would experience:

- 1- Health and Wellness:
- **2-** Transportation options and improved quality of life:
- 3- Conservation and Environment:
- 4- Economic revitalization and tourism:
- 5- Historic preservation and community identity:

Along with this approximate additional 24 miles of county trails, the plan would add three more communities; Meire Grove, Spring Hill and Lake Henry, to the trail network as well as travel within 1-1/2 miles of the Spring Hill County Park. Perhaps the greatest result of this project would be that the new trail would create three trail loops. These trail loops are desired by those already using our trails, and the many bikers seeking the results of what is being proposed. Loops also present a great opportunity for biking events for any community on the trail and would benefit all.

Using Google Earth and taking the liberty to create a route through Paynesville to Roscoe, and from Cold Spring through St John's University to Collegeville, I estimate the lengths of the different loops as follows:

85 miles: I-94/MN-4 to Paynesville to Cold Spring to Collegeville to start:

77 miles: Albany to Greenwald to Paynesville to Cold Spring to Collegeville to Albany

35 miles: I-94/MN-4 to Greenwald to Albany to start

The completed trail system would connect 20 Stearns county communities to a trail network totaling 195 miles. This network includes the following trails: Lake Wobegon, Glacial Lakes, Dairyland, Central Lakes, Lake Koronis Recreation, along with this proposed trail. Together, they extend out of Stearns County to Fergus Falls, Wilmar, Sibley State Park, and US-10 south of Little Falls. With the enthusiasm of our people and our cities, Stearns County could quickly establish itself as a statewide biking destination.

The list of the cities on the completed network include: Albany, Avon, Brooten, Cold Spring, Collegeville, Elrosa, Freeport, Greenwald, Holdingford, Lake Henry, Meire Grove, Melrose, New Munich, Paynesville, Richmond, Roscoe, Sauk Centre, St Cloud, St Joseph, and Waite Park.

#### **Street Lighting**

As we discussed in October, the street light bids are due on Thursday, November 30<sup>th</sup>. We are anticipating bids from 2 or 3 contractors for the work. Since we last met, the engineering department for the manufacturer of the lighting units determined that the existing fixtures are not well suited for transition to LED through the retrofit kits that were originally proposed. As the retrofit recommendation came directly from the manufacturer, they have agreed to provide all new fixtures to the City at the cost of the LED retrofit kit. This will result in all new lights on the poles for the same cost as the retrofit. This is about a \$50,000 savings.

#### **Welle Country Acres**

We are on track for submittal of plans to USDA by end of November. Once completed, the review will allow us to bid in January, per the most recent schedule. We will be bidding as a single combined project with USDA funding for all work except the streets.

#### **Grant Applications**

Letters of intent to apply have been submitted for the active transportation and transportation alternatives programs. We expect to hear back on both and to be invited for a full application in the next few weeks. The local road improvement program does not require a letter of intent and Jon and I will work on the formal submittal in time for the December 8<sup>th</sup> deadline. County sponsorship has already been obtained.

#### County Road 157

Stearns County is reconstructing County Road 157 between Freeport and Albany in either 2024 or 2025, depending on how some funding decisions line up. The County Engineer will be in contact with City staff regarding some cost sharing that could be required. No major improvements are planned in Freeport, and no utility conflicts have been identified.

Re: Earned Sick and Safe Time

Earned Sick and Safe Time (ESST) is a new law that requires employers to offer a minimum amount of time off starting January 2024. The City of Freeport, for the most part, is compliant with our current PTO plan. The following changes will be made in addition to changing any other items that refer to *PTO* in our personnel policy to *ESST*.

## Paid Time Off (PTO) Earned Sick and Safe Time (ESST)

PTO ESST replaces PTO and may be used as it is accrued for the purposes and persons identified in MN Statutes 181.9445, 18139446, 181.9447, and 181.9448 (2003) and under the provisions as set forth in those statutes. This includes but is not limited to:

- 1. the employee's mental or physical illness, treatment or preventive care;
- 2. a family member's mental or physical illness, treatment or preventive care;
- 3. absence due to domestic abuse, sexual assault or stalking of the employee or a family member;
- 4. closure of the employee's workplace due to weather or public emergency or closure of a family member's school or care facility due to weather or public emergency; and
- 5. when determined by a health authority or health care professional that the employee or a family member is at risk of infecting others with a communicable disease.

#### Employees may use ESST for the following family members:

- 1. their child, including foster child, adult child, legal ward, child for whom the employee is legal guardian or child to whom the employee stands or stood in loco parentis (in place of a parent);
- 2. their spouse or registered domestic partner;
- 3. their sibling, stepsibling or foster sibling;
- 4. their biological, adoptive or foster parent, stepparent or a person who stood in loco parentis (in place of a parent) when the employee was a minor child;
- 5. their grandchild, foster grandchild or step-grandchild;
- 6. their grandparent or step-grandparent;
- 7. a child of a sibling of the employee;
- 8. a sibling of the parents of the employee;
- 9. a child-in-law or sibling-in-law;
- 10. any of the family members (1 through 9 above) of an employee's spouse or registered domestic partner;
- 11. any other individual related by blood or whose close association with the employee is the equivalent of a family relationship; and
- 12. up to one individual annually designated by the employee.

replaces individual sick leave, vacation leave, personal leave days and funeral leave plans and combines them into a single benefit program. PTO ESST does not replace City observed holidays, jury duty, military leave, or court leave. Employees accrue PTO ESST based on length of service with the City. Employees will accrue PTO ESST during their training period.
